Leg quarters were in tighter supply from nearby yellow suppliers while stocks of white were at least fully adequate. Thighs remained in good balance while drumsticks were more than sufficient. Wings were unevenly distributed but at least adequate.

In the parts complex, wings were irregularly distributed and somewhat of a push to clear, leg quarters were in close balance to tight, breast items and legs were adequate to fully adequate.
