-Milk sales in gallon jugs have been legal in Pennsylvania for several years, but establishments to make the sales have been very scarce.

Sales of the white liquid in the Lititz area will get a boost next week with the opening of a new bulk salesroom.

Mr. Neil Clark, who operates two retail routes in and around Lititz, will begin sales of milk in gallon containers within the next few days.

Milk has been sold at retail from Spruce Villa since 1905 when the father of the present operator, Milton Brubaker went from door to door with a horse and wagon and sold milk from cans.

Later, with the addition of pasteurizing, homogenizing, and bottling equipment and a large herd, the business expanded to the two routes of today.

Shooting for an opening date of May 15, Clark is looking for an enlarged consumption of milk. Since all the milk sold in bulk must be produced on the farm, expansion of the herd is a possible outcome of the whole program.

"We will continue with the retail routes just as we have been in the past," Clark said this week, "but if anyone wants to drive out to the

farm to take advantage of the wholesale price of milk in bulk, we will be glad to serve them."

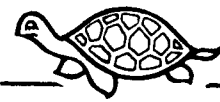
Sponsored by PennAg Industries Association, an Ephrata-based agribusiness trade organization, this conference will provide updates on regulations of interest to agribusiness.

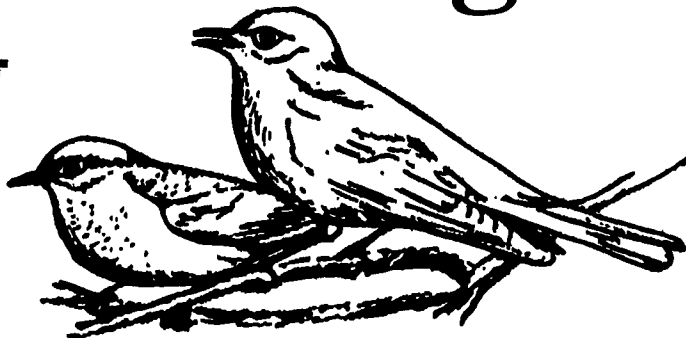

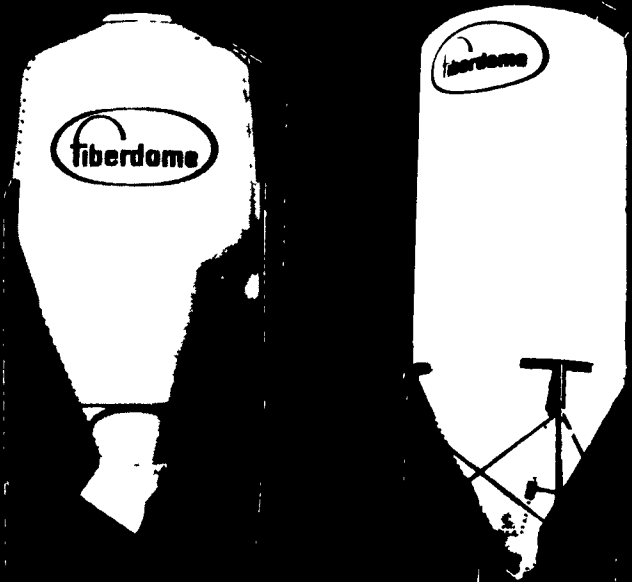
