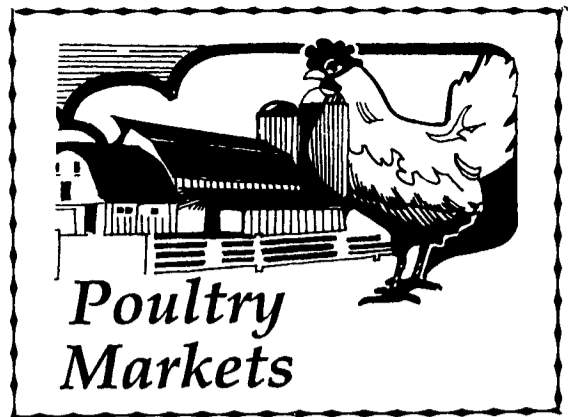

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE Prices were unchanged. The market tone was mostly steady to some what fully steady in the Midwest, South Central and Southeast regions. Retail, food service, and breaker demand was fair to good, best into retail channels with features. Floor stocks were usually adequate, and additional offerings were generally available with ungraded class 1's and 2's in the shortest supply. Breakers generally paid higher prices for shell eggs, and offerings became limited. Live hen markets were about steady, and plants worked shortened schedules.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS. FEDERAL-STATE: Trucklot buying interest was light and selective. Offerings of boneless skinless breasts were adequate in light volume for immediate delivery, tight on large volumes, however, trucklot sales noted for late week and early next week arrival at inside of current price levels. Whole breasts were readily available and the bulk of current business was at lower levels. Leg items were fully adequate to ample and legs and leg quarters were slow in clearing, particularly yellow stocks. Wings were fully adequate.
