May 22, 1991

Prices were unchanged. The market tone was mostly steady to instances fully steady. Demand remained mostly moderate in a wide range, best where featured, and where improvement was noted for the Memorial Day weekend. Supplies were adequate except jumbo and extra-large were often short and sought. Offerings to breakers were generally adequate, and some plants planned reduced holiday schedules. Live hen offerings were at least adequate for the unaggressive demand, and the undertone was steady to weak, mostly barely steady.
