WHEAT PRICES HIGHER WEDNESDAY, CORN LOWER AND SOYBEAN PRICES MIXED. WHEAT 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. CORN STEADY TO 1 CENT LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER AND SOYBEANS HIGHLY MIXED. WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED TO WORK HIGHER DESPITE LACK OF EXPORT ORDERS. SOME DRY SPOTS IN SOUTHWEST AND HI PLAINS AREA BUT FOR THE MOST PART WHEAT CROP LOOKING GOOD HARVEST ALREADY UNDERWAY IN TEXAS AND READY TO MOVE INTO OKLAHOMA. CORN PRICES MODERATELY LOWER ALTHOUGH PLANTING IN MANY AREAS MUCH BEHIND NORMAL. EXPORT ORDERS FEW AND FAR BETWEEN THIS WEEK. SOYBEAN PRICES MADE SUBSTANTIAL GAINS PAST TWO DAYS BUT CLOSED MIXED WEDNESDAY. U.S.S.R. CREDIT DETERMINATION VERY INFLUENTIAL IN SOYBEAN TRADE. WET SPRING DELAYING CORN AND COTTON PLANTINGS MAY CAUSE INCREASE IN SOYBEAN ACRES. SOYBEAN MEAL AND OIL HIGHER

AGAIN WEDNESDAY AND MADE SUBSTANTIAL GAINS PAST TWO OR THREE DAYS.


