

## Jr. Holstein Judging Schools Set

STATE COLLEGE (Centre Co.) — The 1991 Pennsylvania Junior Holstein Association Judging Schools are in final planning stages.

All junior members, regardless of breed orientation, are invited to attend the school nearest to their home. 4-H and FFA members are also invited to attend one of the schools.

The two-day schools run from noon one day to noon the next. Twelve classes are judged, each person in attendance has an opportunity to work one-on-one with an experienced judge on giving reasons. All the basics of judging cattle are covered by our school official.

The school officials this year are Richard Keene, Gilbertsville, N.Y., and Curtis Day, of Shippensburg. They are both well-known judges having worked national shows. They are excellent teachers. Both have spent a lot of time working with their respective county 4-H judging teams.

The Western School is to be held July 7 and July 8, with Blair County Holstein Club acting as host. Curtis Day is to be the official for that school. Host farms include that of John and Robert Black, the Thomas Kelley farm, Burket Falls Farms, Bernetto Gable and David Stonerook.

The Eastern School is scheduled for July 9 and July 10 in Susquehanna County with Richard Keene serving as official.

The cost is \$25 each for those staying overnight. That includes school costs, hotel room and an evening meal. For commuters, the cost is \$15, which covers school costs and an evening meal.

This year, a second member of the same family attending the school receives a \$5 registration discount.

## AGA Announces National Convention Plans

The 114th American Guernsey Association (AGA) annual meeting will be held in St. Louis, Mo., on June 24. The convention, scheduled for June 21-24, will be held at the Breckenridge Frontenac Hotel.

The Missouri Guernsey Breeders' Association has planned a number of relaxing, enjoyable social events during the weekend prior to the meeting.

Some of the activities include a tour of the Gateway Arch of St. Louis, a Cardinals baseball game, the Missouri Botanical Gardens, Anheuser Busch Brewery and a Missouri hometown dinner. These are just a few of the activities planned during the convention.

For the youth some of the events scheduled include a quiz bowl competition, the queen contest and spending a day at the amusement park, "Six Flags Over Mid-

America".

During the annual youth banquet, Saturday evening, the national outstanding Guernsey youth will be named as well as the Outstanding Young Guernsey Farmer and the 1991 National Guernsey Queen will be crowned.

Some of the awards presented at this year's convention include the Master Breeder Award which will be awarded to J. Jene Mungle of Atoka, Ok.

Breeder and developer of Mungles Guernsey Farm, Mr. Mungle has contributed many years of dedicated service and quality cattle to the Guernsey breed. He was the breeder of the national grand champion at last year's show in Louisville, Ky.

Leslie Peckham of Fort Atkinson, Wis., is the recipient of the AGA Distinguished Service Award.

Peckham has spent 27 years working for the AGA promoting the Guernsey cow. His main area was Wisconsin, Minnesota and Iowa, but he has gained great respect nation-wide for his knowledge and dedication to the Guernsey breed.

Directors for district five and director-at-large will be announced at the annual meeting on June 24.

Eldon Moss of Iowa City, Iowa, and Phil Tennis of Hayward, Minn., are the two nominees for district five. All active members of district five are eligible to vote by ballot until June 23.

This district is comprised of the states of Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota. Director at large is contested by incumbent Dave Bolin of Clarksville, Iowa, and Kevin Nedrow of Clifton Springs, New York.

All active members nation-wide are eligible to vote.

Following the annual meeting, the National Convention and Heifer Sale will be held in the grand ballroom at the Breckenridge Frontenac Hotel. Approximately 55 head of top quality Guernseys from around the United States will be auctioned.

Headlining the sale are Excellent cows with high production, fancy show heifers, bull packages and potential bull mothers.
