Susquehanna River Commission Proposes Water Use Fees For Farming Operations

(Continued from Page A1) als was held late last month in the commission's offices in Harrisburg. Richard Kreider, Manheim, was the only farmer present.

"When I became award of this proposal, I became concerned because none of the farmers I contacted knew about this proposal," Kreider said. "Potentially, anyone who uses water in a commercial or agricultural operation would be liable to the fees and consumption control by the commission."

Kreider said that at the hearing many questions about farming operations could not be answered. Questions such as: What fines would be charged if noncompliance was discovered? Who would investigate the compliance requirements? Are present farming operations included, so that a farmer who uses water would become responsible to obtain a permit to continue operation?

Michael Brubaker, a private agronomy consultant from Lititz said that a major concern with this proposal is that it puts regulation where we never had regulation before. "What are the impacts for expansion of agriculture?" Brubaker asked. "How easy will it be to lower the minimums so that more farmers are covered by the regulation?"

Both Brubaker and Kreider urge farmers to contact the commission to ask questions about their farm operation and to make written comments immediately so they can be in time for the commission's consideration.
