#### National Egg Market June 5, 1991

Prices were lower on mediums and smalls in the Midwest and New England, unchanged on the balance. The market tone was steady on the large sizes, steady to weak on the small sizes. Demand was mixed across the full range, and was best where featured, mostly moderate overall. Supplies of jumbo, extra-large and heavy nest runs were short to adequate, and generally more available. Large supplies were adequate, and the smaller sizes were adequate to long. Breakers selectively purchased shell eggs at unchanged to lower prices. Live hen markets were barely steady to weak; demand remained light for the ample supplies.
