## STRIPED DELIGHT

1½ cups graham cracker crumbs  
¼ cup sugar  
¼ cup melted butter  
1 8-ounce package cream cheese  
¼ cup sugar  
2 tablespoons milk  
1 8-ounce container whipped topping  
2 boxes instant pudding  
3½ cups cold milk  
Combine cracker crumbs  
¼ cup sugar, and melted butter  
Press firmly into bottom of  
13x9-inch pan. Beat cream cheese  
with sugar and 2 tablespoons milk  
until smooth. Fold in half the  
whipped topping. Spread over  
crust. Prepare pudding as directed  
on package, using 3½ cups milk.  
Pour over cream cheese mixture.  
Chill several hours. Spread  
remaining whipped topping over  
pudding. *Delicious.*

## LEMON CUSTARD PIE

1½ cups plus 2 tablespoons  
sugar, divided  
¼ teaspoon cream of tartar  
4 eggs, separated  
1 tablespoon lemon rind  
4 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 cups heavy cream  
Preheat oven to 275 degrees.  
Grease the bottom and sides of  
9-inch pie plate.

Sift 1 cup sugar and cream of  
tartar. Beat egg whites to stiff. Grad-  
ually add the sugar mixture, beat-  
ing until well blended. Scrape the  
meringue into the pie plate. Build  
the mixture up around the edges to  
form a shell. Bake 1 hour. Remove  
to rack to cool.

Beat the yolks until light and  
lemon colored. Add ½ cup sugar,  
lemon rind and juice and heat to  
blend. Cook in top of double boiler  
until thickened; stir constantly.  
Remove from heat, cool.

Whip 1 cup cream until stiff and  
fold into the lemon filling. Pour  
into the shell; chill until filling is  
set.

Whip the remaining cream and 2  
tablespoons sugar until soft peaks  
form. Spoon on top of pie filling.  
Chill uncovered for 24 hours.  
Serves 6 to 8.

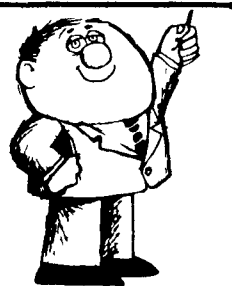
