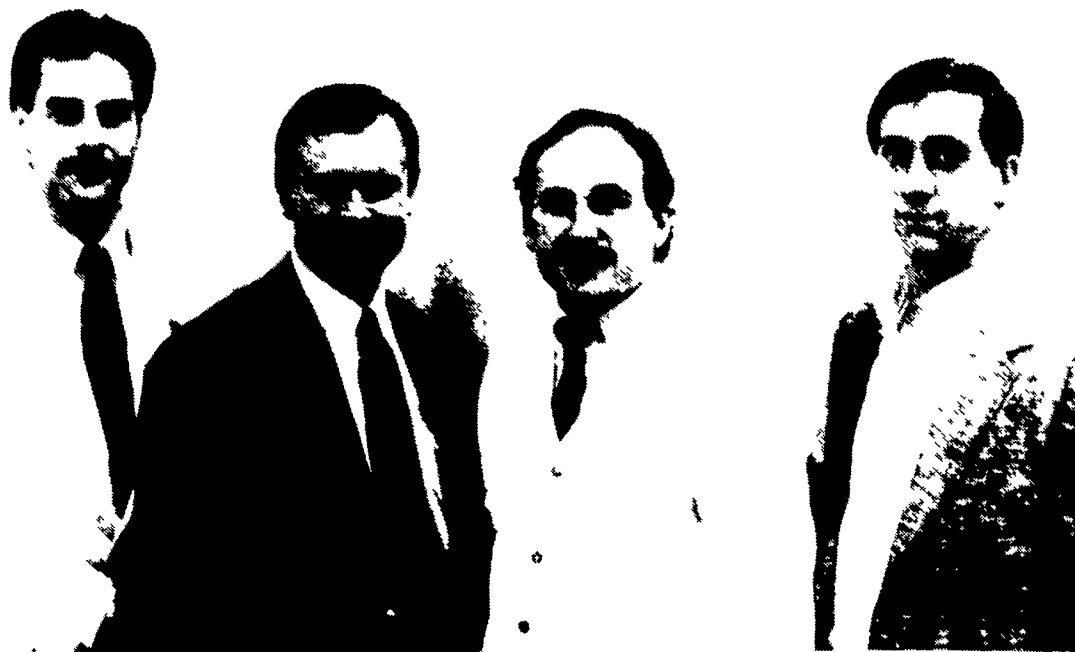




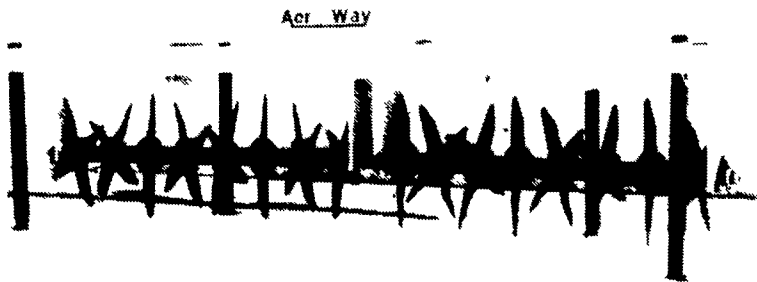
Chore-Time Presents Award

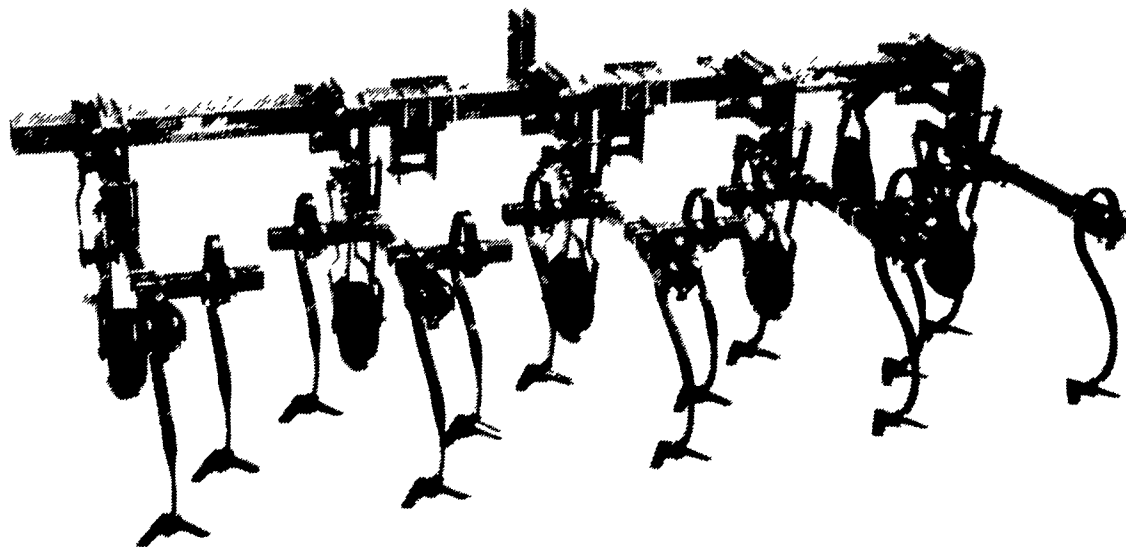
