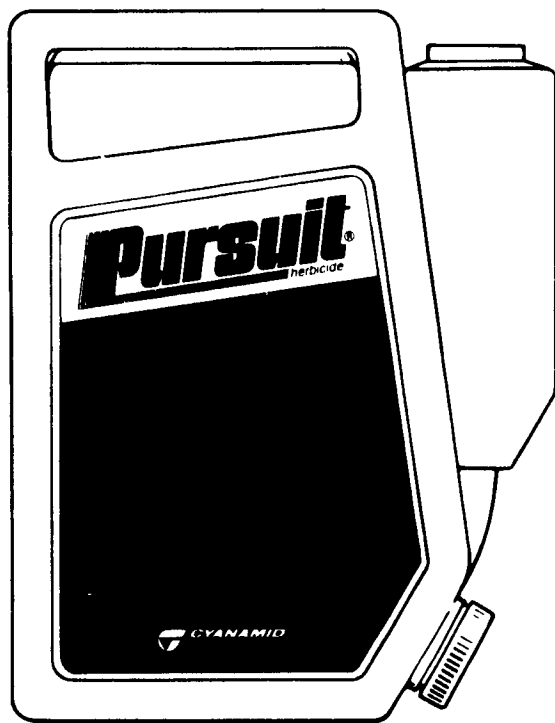

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*How to use PURSUIT® herbicide: Application: "early post-*
