

Junior Angus Show Draws Youth Throughout U.S.

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — Junior Angus exhibitors paraded 169 Angus cattle entries before judge Brad Worthington, Cloverdale, Indiana, at the 1991 Atlantic National Junior Angus Show in Timonium, Maryland.

The grand champion bred-and-owned heifer was owned by Zachary Weaver, Peoria, Illinois, and was named WAF Julia Belle 005. First named the spring heifer calf champion, the heifer is a January 1990 daughter of Hoff Hi Spade S C 491.

The reserve grand champion bred-and-owned heifer was Kruegers Belladonna exhibited by Erin Krueger, Coatesville, Pennsylvania.

nia. A March 1989 daughter of Grubbs Mac Kenzie, the heifer first topped the junior division.

In "owned" heifer competition, grand champion laurels were presented to Angela Johnson, Mt. Airy, Maryland, for her senior heifer calf winner. D A Brittany 7693 is the name of the grand winner that is a September 1989 daughter of Brost Dan Patch.

The reserve grand champion "owned" heifer entry was S A V Mac Jestress 1761 owned by Sarah Hill, Bidwell, Ohio. The reserve winner first won the spring calf division and is a February 1990 daughter of Grubbs Mac Kenzie.

In steer competition, R R Ponderosa 2260 won grand champion honors for Ty Krebs, Gordon, Nebraska. The steer is a February 1990 son of 76 R Ponderosa 216W. He weighed 1,095 pounds and had a weight per day of age of 2.42 pounds.

The reserve grand steer was a 1,045-pound entry owned by Casey High of Litz, Pennsylvania. The April 1990 son of Rally Ivy League 171 had a weight per day of age of 2.52 pounds and was named F W Bart 12.

In the cow-calf pair division, Carousel Monique won the bred-and-owned cow with natural calf division. The cow is a March 1989 daughter of Skyway Hill Big

Time. The bull calf is an April 1991 son of T C Stockman.

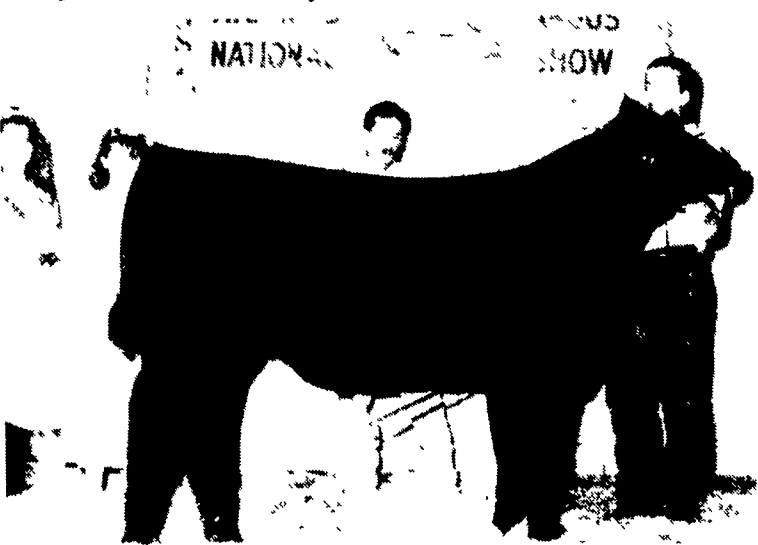

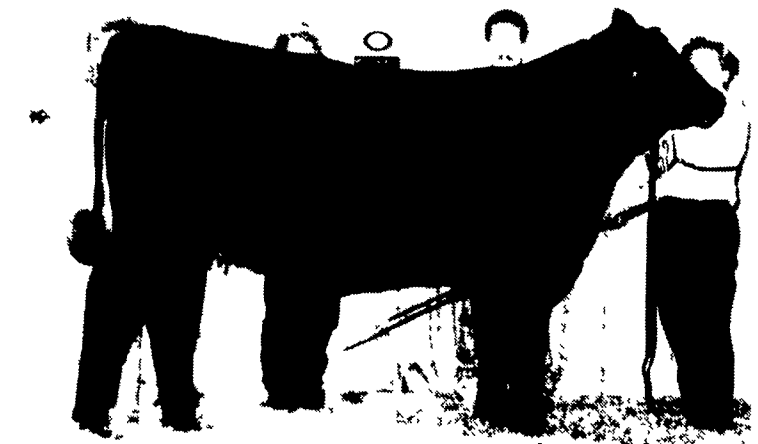
