On-farm management practices indicate that paper, either as the sole bedding or an extender for other forms, is adaptable to many different management systems. Nearly one-half used paper as the only bedding in the tie- or free-

stalls and found this to be satisfactory. The remainder of those using it in stalls and nearly all using it in pens or boxstalls mixed it with other bedding at approximately a 50/50 ratio. Interestingly, several reported successfully using whole papers, mixed with straw or fodder in pens.

Reported disadvantages or "dislikes" were surveyed, with only blowing around the barn receiving significant "votes". Other possible negatives, such as excessive packing, plugging of grates or gravity systems, dust, or chemical and fire hazard were of concern to some, (Turn to Page A39)

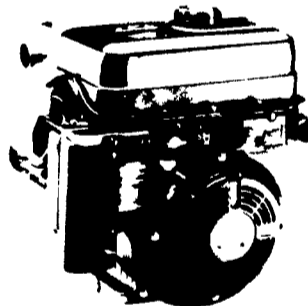
