Additional offerings were light, and usually sold rapidly when offered. Breakers provided a mixed demand for shell eggs, and some plants limited shell egg receipts to previous commitments only while others aggressively sought breaking stocks. Live hen markets were also mixed from steady in the Midwest and Northeast to often fully steady in the Southeast and South Central areas.

Trade sentiment was barely steady. In the parts complex, supplies of wings were barely adequate to adequate, breast items were adequate, dark meat was adequate to fully adequate.

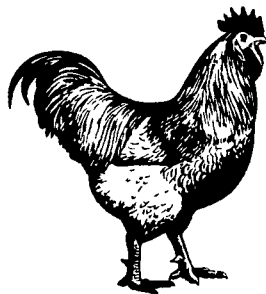

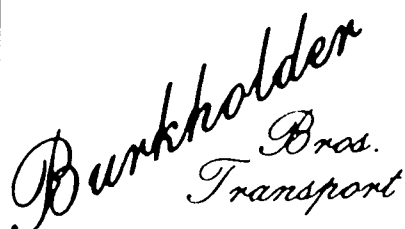
