were lower at 50 - 60 cents. Live supplies were adequate. Average live weights ranged desirable to light. Processing schedules were heavy. Trade sentiment was weak. In the parts complex, supplies of wings ranged close balance to fully adequate, leg quarters ranged adequate to ample, boneless skinless breast were adequate to fully adequate, all other items were fully adequate and generally slow to clear.

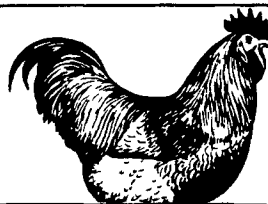
