GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED THEIR ROLLER COASTER PATTERN WEDNESDAY AS MARKETS FELL SHARPLY AFTER TUESDAY'S STRONG RALLY. WHEAT 5 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. CORN 2 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 2 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 9 TO 13 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES FELL MODERATELY ON SPILLOVER WEAKNESS FROM CORN AND SOYBEAN LOSSES. PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD WEIGHED ON WHEAT PRICES. PRESSURE FROM IDEAS FOR GOOD YIELDS IN U.S. SPRING WHEAT GROWING REGION AND A LACK OF SOVIET PRESSURE IN U.S. WHEAT MARKETS ALSO DROVE PRICES LOWER. LOSSES IN WHEAT PRICES WERE CUSHIONED BY ACTIVE EXPORT DEMAND THIS WEEK. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES PLUNGED DOWNWARD ON EXPECTED COOLER TEMPERATURES IN MIDWEST THE NEXT FEW DAYS AND WILL HOPEFULLY REDUCE STRESS ON CROPS. VERY LITTLE RAIN EXPECTED TO ACCOMPANY COOLER WEATHER.

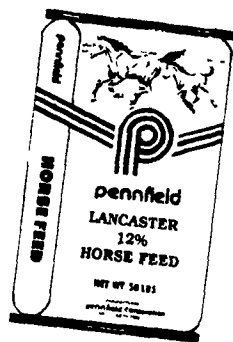

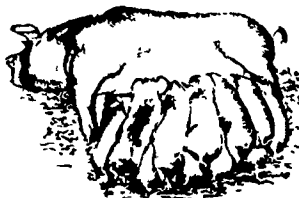
