— Want to test your knowledge on pasture management? If you do, make sure to visit the Soil Conservation Service (SCS)'s interactive exhibit on pasture management in the conservation-education tent at Ag Progress Days.

The exhibit is called "Manage Your Pa\$ture For Profit\$." Two panels of the display show a drawing of cows grazing in a managed pasture. The third panel consists of four questions designed to test people's knowledge of pasture management. Right answers will be rewarded with a blinking light; wrong answers with a buzzing sound. Publications explaining

pasture management in more detail will be available at the display table.

"The exhibit shows farmers that using pasture to feed livestock is a very profitable venture if managed properly," says Joel Myers, State Agronomist for SCS and Chairman of the Ag Progress Days Conservation Committee. "These are hard times for farmers and they should explore all alternatives to save costs on feed. This is an excellent alternative to explore."

A program on pasture management will be held during the three-day event as well, says Myers. Thomas Calvert, Area Agronomist with SCS in Somerset County, will discuss intensive rotational

grazing systems, including paddock size, fencing selection, watering equipment as well as vegetation. He will also give tips on such topics as matching livestock to acres of available pasture. Calvert will cover information for both the beginner and the advanced farmer. The workshop will be held 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. daily. An additional one will be held at 3:30 p.m. on Wednes-

day only.




