USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES MIXED; CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES PRESSURED BY FORECAST POR SHOWERS ACROSS MIDWEST. CORN 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. SORG-HUM 7 TO 13 CENTS LOWER. SOY-BEANS 7 TO 12 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES MIXED WEDNES-DAY WITH SOME PRESSURE DUE TO LOWER CORN AND BEAN PRICES. RECENT GOOD EXPORT DEMAND LIMITED LOSSES IN WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES DECLINED FROM PRO-FIT TAKING ON THE BOARD AND SPILLOVER WEAKNESS IN BEAN PRICES. SOUTH KOREA'S PASS ON CORN OFFERINGS AND OPTIONAL ORIGIN PURCHASE ALSO WEIGHED ON CORN PRICES. SOYBEAN PRICES TOOK ANOTHER SHARP DROP DUE TO UPPER MIDWEST RECEIVING MOISTURE. RAINS FORECAST FOR MIDWEST BENEFICIAL TO CORN CROP BUT MORE IMPORTANT TO BEANS AT THIS STAGE OF DEVE-LOPMENT. DECLINES ON THE BOARD RESULTED DUE TO STOP-LOSS LIQUIDATION TAKEN BY TRADERS AFTER TUESDAY'S EXTREMELY SHARP DOWNTURN IN BEAN PRICES.
