

## National Grain Market

SUMMARY GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FELL IN LATE, FAST PACE AGGRESSIVE TRADING ON FUTURES WEDNESDAY. CORN LEAD THE DOWNWARD PARADE AND OTHER COMMODITIES FOLLOWED. WHEAT STEADY TO 5 CENTS LOWER. CORN 6 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 13 TO 19 CENTS LOWER.

SOYBEANS 2 TO 10 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES DECLINED ON SPILLOVER WEAKNESS FROM CORN AND BEAN PITS. SOME SUPPORT FROM EXPORT BUYING LIMITED WHEAT LOSSES. CORN PRICES FELL SHARPLY, MORE THAN HALF THE DAILY LIMIT, AS MASSIVE TECHNICAL SELLING TOOK OVER AND PUSHED PRICES DOWN THROUGH SELL-STOPS IN DECEMBER CORN FUTURES. SOYBEAN PRICES WEAKENED AND FOLLOWED CORN PRICES DOWNWARD SPIRAL IN FAST TRADING. GOOD EXPORT ORDERS FOR BEANS FAILED TO GAIN MUCH NOTICE.
