Composting Conference

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — Fall will soon be here and with the season comes leaves and other green material from the trees, shrubs, vegetable and flower gardens.

One way to easily take care of this material is through composting. Composting is an age old art that has been rediscovered because of recent legislation limiting yard and garden waste into landfills.

All classes are designed for the gardening public and are to be informative for the novice or seasoned gardener.

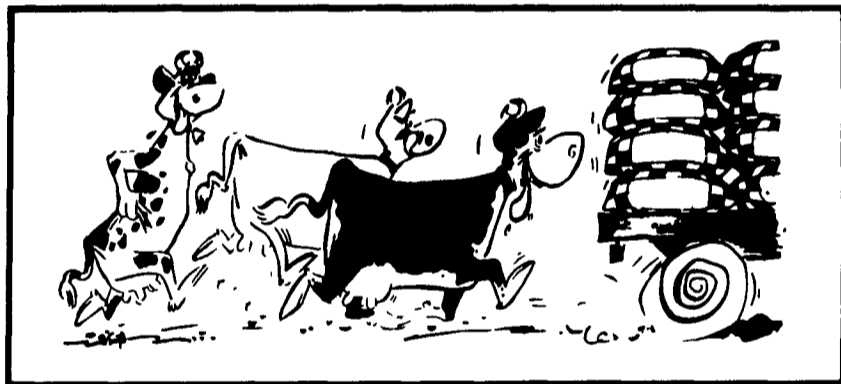
