One way to easily take care of this material is through composting. Composting is an age old art that has been rediscovered because of recent legislation limiting yard and garden waste into landfills.



The course is to be held in the downstairs classrooms of the Farm and Home Center, located at 1383 Arcadia Road in Lancaster.


