UDS, Up Country Cheese Sign Agreement

SENECA FALLS, N.Y. — United Dairy Services located in Seneca Falls, N.Y., has recently entered into an agreement with Up Country Cheese of Le Raysville, Pa. to provide management, marketing, accounting, quality control and producer services for their cooperative and cheese manufacturing facility.

United Dairy Services is equipped to provide such services for the dairy industry and other agricultural organizations.

Up Country Cheese manufactures numerous specialty cheeses such as raw milk aged cheddar, by the old fashioned hand made Amish method, farmer's cheese, feta, Swiss, Somilier and cheese curd.

The business began when a plant, Fairdale Creamery closed down its operations in 1977. A group of mostly Amish dairy farmers needed a place to sell their milk. They formed a cooperative and established a cheese plant

using Amish old country methods and hard work.

The cooperative then decided to sell the plant and equipment to a local dairy farmer, James Amory, who took over management duties and leased the plant back to the members to continue cheese making.

Milk used in the processing is supplied by the cooperative members who are mostly local small volume dairy farmers. These smaller family dairy farmers would otherwise have difficulty marketing their milk because handlers and large cooperatives do not believe they can profitably handle small amounts from remote locations.

Up Country Cheese House is a small store in the front of the cheese plant where customers, both local residents and tourists, can not only purchase products made there but also observe through a window the cheese making in progress.

Additional outlets are local stores, gourmet shops and delis in Manhattan's Greenwich Village and Macy's Gourmet Store. Also Up Country Cheese House cheeses are sold at Craft Shows and Flea Markets.

Edward D. Anna, president of United Dairy Services said, "We are looking forward to working with Up Country Cheese, providing expanded markets and product lines, together with useful services, thereby increasing the profitability for local dairy farm families."

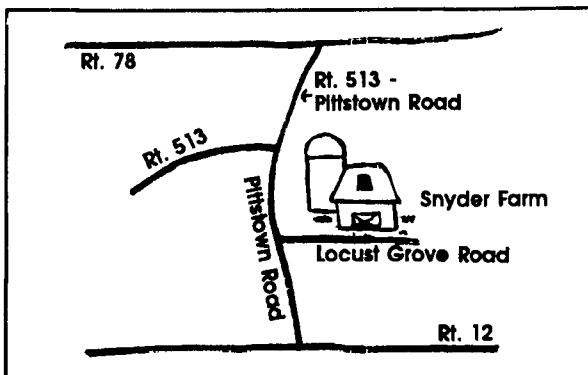

 Directions to Snyder Research and Extension Farm:
From North: Take Interstate 78 to Exit 15, go left at bottom of exit ramp - Route 513 south/Pittstown Road. Stay on Pittstown Road for 6 miles THROUGH Pittstown (don't follow Route 513 in Pittstown to right - follow Pittstown Road/Route 615 south). Turn left on Locust Grove Road, 1/2 mile - farm is on left.
From South (Trenton area): Take Route 202 & 31 north to Flemington traffic circle. Take route 12 west at circle. Go 8 miles to Pittstown Road (airport sign). Turn north (right), and go 3.5 miles to Locust Grove Road. Go right for 1/2 mile.

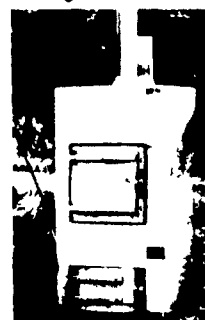
