GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES SHOT SHARPLY HIGHER WEDNESDAY RISING TO THEIR LIMIT FOR CORN AND BEANS ON REPORT OF CRUMBLING SOVIET MILITARY COUP. WHEAT 13 TO 21 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 9 TO 12 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 18 TO 21 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 25 TO 33 CENTS HIGHER. NEWS INDICATING SOVIET CITIZENS RESISTED THE MILITARY COUP AND DROVE HARD-LINE COMMUNIST TROOPS TO FAILURE, INSTANTLY SENT COMMODITY PRICES SHARPLY HIGHER. FARMER SELLING IN MIDWEST VERY LIGHT AS CORN AND BEAN PRICES MOVED DRASTICALLY HIGHER. NO OFFICIAL WORD ON STATUS OF FARM EXPORT CREDITS TO U.S.S.R. BUT TRADE INDUSTRY OPTIMISTIC THAT SOVIET DEMAND WILL CONTINUE, ADDING STRENGTH TO PRICES. VERY GOOD EXPORT DEMAND FOR WHEAT AND CORN ALSO SUPPORTED PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: TAIWAN'S TRADE TEAM BOUGHT APPROXIMATELY 84,800 TONNES WESTERN WHITE WHEAT IN WASHINGTON. PAKISTAN BOUGHT 120,000 TONNES OF U.S. NO. 2 OR BETTER SOFT WHITE WHEAT FOR SHIPMENT AUG/SEP SHIPMENT UNDER GSM-102. SOUTH KOREA BOUGHT 22,000 TONNES U.S. WHEAT FOR OCTOBER SHIPMENT. WESTERN AND CENTRAL AFRICAN COUNTRIES BOUGHT 3,000 TONNES OF WHEAT UNDER THE EXPORT BONUS PROGRAM FOR OCTOBER SHIPMENT. FINLAND BOUGHT 7,000 TONNES OF SOFT WHITE WHEAT UNDER EBP FOR SEP/OCT SHIPMENT. SOUTH KOREA BOUGHT 100,000 METRIC TONS OF CORN FOR 91/92 MARKETING YEAR.
