About 200 herds have signed up for the DHIA Heifer Management program. A number of options are available to participating dairymen as to what reports they want to receive on their heifer herd. The percentage of herds choosing each option are given below.

Five herds have 250 cows or more and 25 herds have more than 100 cows. However, 90 herds have less than 50 cows. Overall, average herd size (63.5) is very close to the state average of 61.5 cows for all herds on

Enrollment of new herds slowed considerably in April and May. It will likely remain slow until next fall. A strong educational effort by DHIA, AI and Extension should make it possible to reach the goal of 300 herds enrolled during the program's first year.

ARIS allows dairymen and their authorized veterinarians and nutritional consultants to access individual DHIA herd records from s personal computer to the main computer in State College. Call the State DHIA office num-ber lieted in the FOCUS column head to learn more about how you can use this unique DHIA service to increase the profitability of your herd and the DHIA records you produce.

Q. If I subscribe to ARIS, will I be able to automatically access anyone's records in the state?

A. No, you will only be able to access data for the herds which are authorized to you. A dairyman will get automatic access to his own herd when he subscribes to ARIS. Any consultant or dairyman who wishes to access a herd other than his own must have a release form signed by the herd owner. After the form is sent to the state office, it will be checked for accuracy and then herd access will be given to the authorized ARIS user.

Costs For Handy Reference
