GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FINISHED MIXED IN ACTIVE TRAD-ING WEDNESDAY. WHEAT MIXED. CORN UNCHANGED TO UP 1 CENT. SORGHUM UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 6 TO 9 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES MIXED, LACK OF EXPORT DEMAND WEAKENED PRICES. PROMISED AID TO BALTIC REPUBLICS AND CHINAS EXPORT INTEREST FAILED TO STI-MULATE WHEAT TRADE. SHORT COVERINGS, SPURRED BY SHARP ADVANCE IN SOYBEANS, STRENGTHENED CORN PRICES. CORN PRICES HAVE CLIMBED TWENTY TWO CENTS IN PAST TWO WEEKS DUE MAINLY TO U.S.S.R.'S **RECENT POLITICAL UPHEAVAL** AND EXPORT PURCHASES. LATE RALLY IN BEAN PITS LEFT PRICES ON THE PLUS SIDE. DRY WEATHER CONTINUES AND MANY PLACES NEED MOISTURE. CONCERNS OVER EARLY FROST AS LATE HOT, DRY DOG-DAYS OF SUMMER DRAG ON, ALSO SUPPORTED BEAN PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: TAIWANS TRADE TEAM COMPLETED ITS U.S. WHEAT BUYING MISSION WITH THE PURCH-ASE OF 74,500 TONNES HARD RED WINTER WHEAT IN KANSAS. SOUTH KOREA BOUGHT 30,000 TONNES U.S. NO. 1 SOYBEANS FOR OCTOBER.


