Demand was fairly good to excellent. Supplies of brown eggs were generally short to barely adequate, and fairly active export shipments continued to deplete supplies.

Delmarva Broiler Fryer

Sept. 5, 1991

Movement of ready-to-cook broiler fryers was fair to fairly good today. Supplies of 2 1/2 pound sizes were barely adequate to tight, 3 pound and over sizes were adequate to fully adequate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 49 - 58 cents. Live supplies were adequate, with average live weights ranging desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were heavy. Trade sentiment was generally steady. In the parts complex, supplies of wings and breast items were adequate, legs and leg quarters were in close balance.

National Egg Market

Sept. 4, 1991

Prices were generally unchanged. The market tone was generally steady to instances fully steady. Demand was moderate to good, best where featured. Sup-

plies were generally adequate with some shortages in New England. Breakers received increased offerings of shell eggs, and demand was moderate. Live hen markets were unsettled from barely steady in some Northeast areas to fully steady in northwestern parts of the Midwest, and generally steady overall as live supplies were adequate for the moderate demand.

Eastern PA & NJ Poultry

Sept. 4, 1991

Pricing has stabilized somewhat on light type fowl and too few sales to report on heavy hens. Demand is moderate to sometimes good, however buyers are unaggressive as further processing sales are difficult to book even at lower trending values. Offerings are more available than prior week and generally noted as adequate for desired needs. Undertone unsettled but barely steady.
