Live supplies were adequate, with average live weights ranging desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were heavy. Trade sentiment was generally steady. Eastern PA & NJ Poultry Sept. 4, 1991

Pricing has stabilized somewhat on light type fowl and too few sales to report on heavy hens. Demand is moderate to sometimes good, however buyers are unaggressive as further processing sales are difficult to book even at lower trending values. Offerings are more available than prior week and generally noted as adequate for desired needs. Undertone unsettled but barely steady.
