NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices for larger sizes were unchanged, mediums were unchanged to lower in the Middle Atlantic States, lower in the Midwest, and unchanged in the West. The trade sentiment was about steady on the larger sizes, barely steady to weak on mediums; however, an unsettled and cautious undertone was showing in some areas. Demand was irregular and ranged slow to good with the best movement in areas where retail features were in progress. Supplies were generally adequate with mediums readily available at some locations.
