

What Happens At The Denver Community Fair?



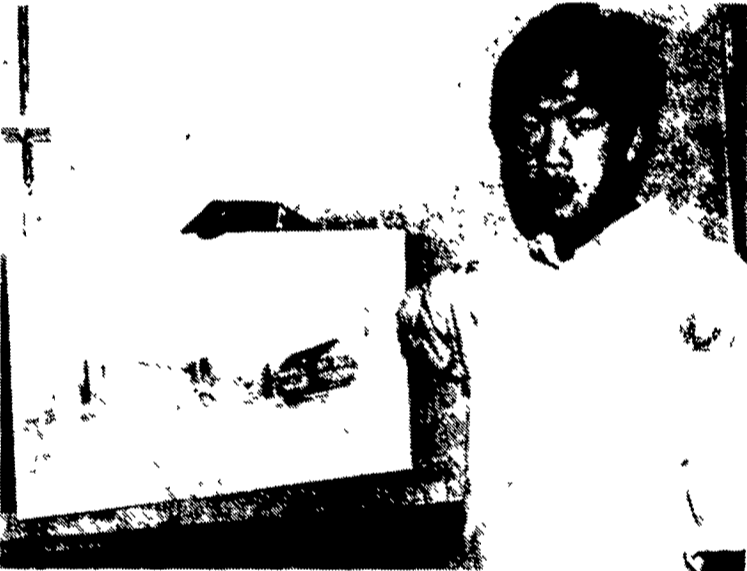
"Hey, Dad. This is the tractor for me." Three-year-old Darren Zimmerman of Lititz chose this tractor at the Denver Fair.



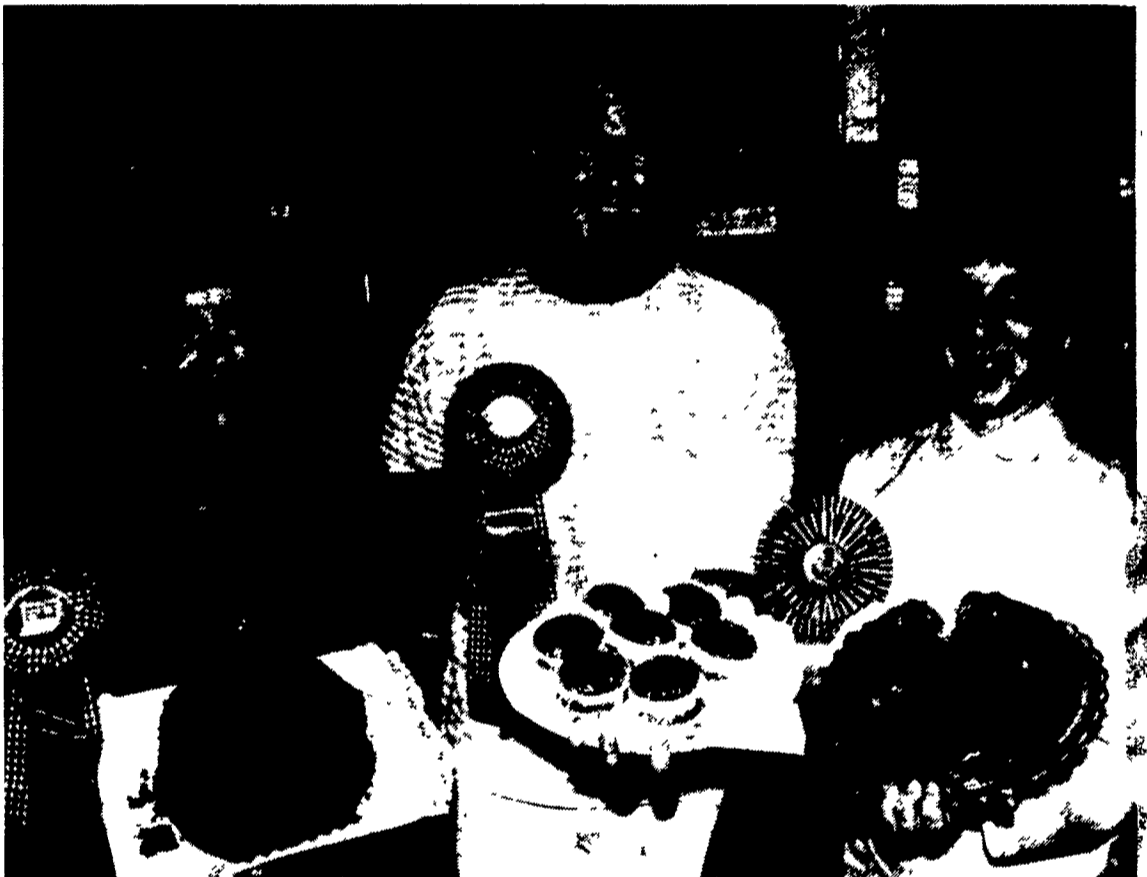
