Movement of ready-to-cook broiler fryers was fair today, and about as expected for mid-week trading. Supplies of 2 3/4 and lighter sizes were barely adequate to tight, heavier sizes were fully adequate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 - 60 cents. Live supplies were adequate. Average live weights ranged desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were heavy. Trade sentiment was generally steady. In the parts complex, supplies of wings were in close balance, breast items were adequate to fully adequate, dark meat was fully adequate.
