

#### National Egg Market Sept. 24, 1991

Prices for white shell eggs were unchanged, brown shell medium eggs trended higher in New England. The trade sentiment was generally steady, but increased cautiousness showed in the New York area. Demand for cartoned eggs was fair to good with the best movement in areas where features are in progress or planned. Supplies were generally adequate for the trade with jumbo eggs short in the Detroit area and mediums adequate to ample in Southern California. The trade sentiment for breaking stock was at least steady, trading was light, supplies were adequate, and prices for nest run stock trended unchanged to higher.
