WHEAT PRICES DECLINED; CORN AND BEANS SLIGHTLY HIGHER TUESDAY. WHEAT 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS STEADY TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER, PRESSURED BY GOOD GROWING CONDITIONS IN HARD RED WINTER WHEAT AREAS. VERY GOOD EXPORT DEMAND FROM EGYPT THIS WEEK AND LAST WEEK, UNDERPINNED WEAKNESS IN WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES SLIGHTLY HIGHER STRENGTHENED BY IDEAS U.S. WILL OFFER MORE EXPORT CREDITS TO SOVIET UNION. REPORTS INDICATE AID TO USSR WILL LIKELY BE CREDITS RATHER THAN DONATIONS. FORECAST FOR RAIN THIS WEEK PUSHED CORN PRICES HIGHER ON CONCERNS OVER HARVEST DELAYS. SOYBEAN PRICES FINISHED STEADY TO SLIGHTLY HIGHER DUE TO IMPROVED EXPORT INTEREST AND HOPES FOR ADDITIONAL CREDIT AID TO U.S.S.R.

EXPORT NEWS: EGYPT BOUGHT 100,000 TONNES NORTHERN/DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT UNDER EXPORT BONUS FOR OCTOBER SHIPMENT. THE CCC ANNOUNCED THE PURCHASE OF 2.071 MILLION POUNDS OF BULK PDSY COTTONSEED OIL FOR USE AS A BONUS, UNDER THE COTTONSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR OCTOBER.
