Also, Dr. Lynn Sammons. of Willow Creek Animal Hospital, is to provide information on how to keep a club calf healthy and will discuss when and when not to use medications and drugs.

Lancaster County native Chris Herr has exhibited numerous entries to the Pennsylvania Farm Show and other major livestock events. He will be sharing his experiences in raising a Farm Show champion steer, which Chris accomplished in 1980.

Also speaking is Chad Cash, a regional manager of Purina Mills, who is to discuss feeding beef calves for market and how to achieve optimum results.

"This is the second year we have brought together some of the industry's most experienced peo-

ple to provide an interesting and informative morning for young people and parents, alike," said Sheila Miller, sale chairman.

This year's sale will feature 24 calves in the ring to be auctioned by Harry Bachman, of Annville. Judge Ron Miller is to select a champion and reserve champion calf before the sale.

Also selling are two purebred Angus steers and three purebred Polled Hereford steers. Females are also selling in this year's sale. Messick Farm of Middletown will be consigning a registered

Simmental heifer and MAP Farm of Womelsdorf will be consigning a registered Polled Hereford.

Several calves sold at previous Dutch Country Calf Sales have earned grand championship titles at fairs.




