

48 Firms Become Top Quality Suppliers

The new relationship will bring additional strength, scope, expertise and world wide germplasm to ABI's existing overall corn research while providing Pau with a direct source of American corn germplasm.

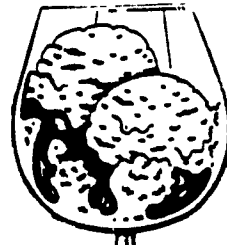
Other products marketed under the AgriPro brand- including soybeans, sorghum, sunflower, and alfalfa, will not be affected by this research agreement.

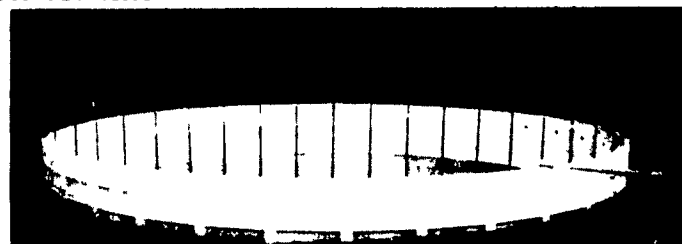
