WHEAT 1 TO 3 LOWER EXCEPT MINNEAPOLIS 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. CORN STEADY TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM MIXED. SOYBEANS STEADY TO 1 CENT LOWER. MARGINAL PRICE CHANGES ALTHOUGH LATE SELLING AT THE BOARD OF TRADE LEFT GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES MOSTLY LOWER. GOOD EXPORT DEMAND AND DRY WEATHER FORECAST FOR HARD RED WINTER WHEAT AREAS FAILED TO SPARK ADVANCES IN WHEAT PRICES. LOWER CORN AND BEAN PRICES CONTINUE TO REACT TO HARVEST PRESSURE. WEATHER REMAINS FAVORABLE AS COMBINES KEEP BUSY. PRIVATE PREDICTIONS BEFORE THURSDAY'S U.S.D.A. CROP PRODUCTION REPORT, FORECAST BETTER THAN EXPECTED CORN AND BEAN YIELDS. SUPPORT RECEIVED FROM GOOD EXPORT PURCHASES KEPT LOSSES LIGHT.


