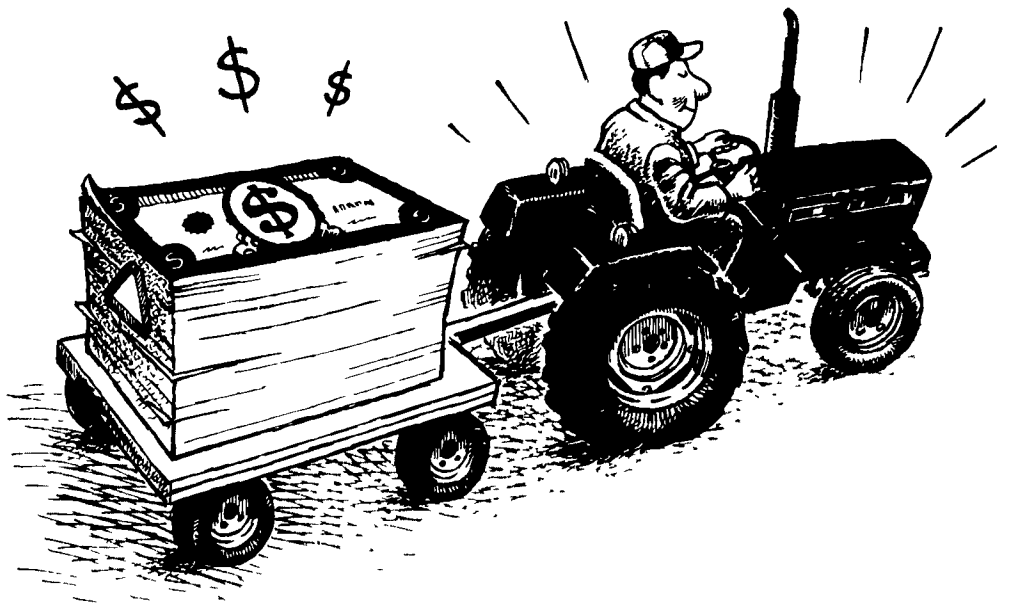

His advice to save taxes included ideas on using conservation easements to preserve the land, for which income tax and estate tax benefits are available, using family limited partnerships instead of corporations to save taxes, life insurance, land swaps, and putting conservation easements in a person's will.
