WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED UPWARD WEDNESDAY; CORN AND BEAN PRICES REGRESSED. WHEAT 1 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT SO. IOWA 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 3 TO 10 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 4 TO 6 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT SO. IOWA 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES MOVED HIGHER AGAIN TODAY ON CONTINUED OPTIMISM FOR NEW SOVIET CREDIT AID. COMMERCIAL BUYING ON THE BOARD AND GOOD EXPORT DEMAND SUPPORTED WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES DECLINED SLIGHTLY DUE TO PROFIT TAKING AND SPILLOVER WEAKNESS FROM BEAN PITS. CORN HARVEST PRESSURE AN IMPORTANT FACTOR FOR LOWER PRICES BEAUTIFUL FALL HARVEST WEATHER CONTINUES TO COOPERATE. ANTICIPATION FOR PENDING USSR CREDITS LIMITED LOSSES FOR CORN AND BEAN PRICES. SUBSTANTIAL GROUND WAS LOST IN BEAN PRICES AS DELAYS IN USSR CREDITS KEEP TRADERS ON SIDE LINES. SOYBEAN HARVEST PROCEEDING ACTIVELY AND EXPECTED RECORD HARVEST PRESURED PRICES.






