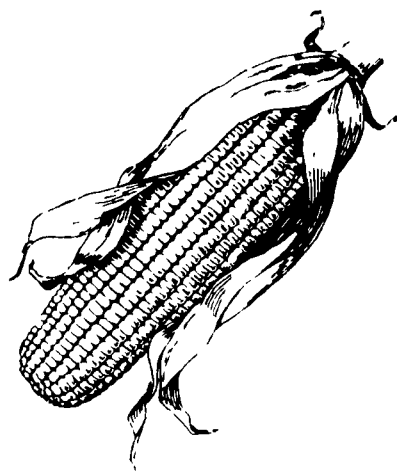
The afternoon program will close with a repeat of the morning breakout sessions, giving individuals an opportunity to hear

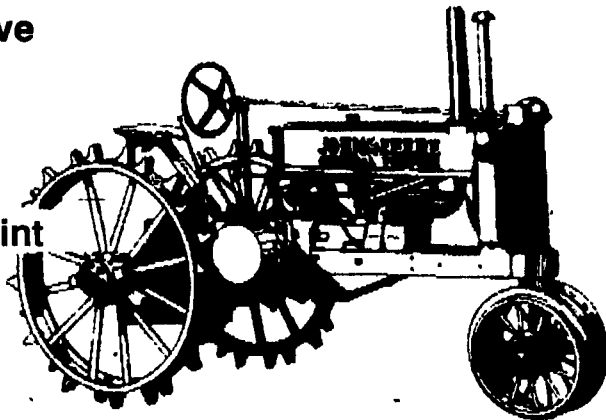
The vice chairman is Paul H. Craig, an agricultural agent in Dauphin County, Pa., for the Penn State Extension Service.
