NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast, and Midwest, and unchanged on the balance. The market tone was steady to weak, mostly barely steady. Demand covered the full range, and was mostly moderate. Retail specials boosted movement, and some areas reported increased first of the month business, while other areas were disappointed with the continued sluggish demand. Supplies were adequate to ample, mostly adequate to fully adequate, and occasionally barely adequate in the Northeast where features depleted supply. Breakers remained unaggressive buyers of surplus shell eggs. Live hen markets were mixed from barely steady to fully steady.

Prices continued their downward spiral. Trading activity was mixed with lower trending values enticing some buyers. Raw materials were usually readily available, but breakers were cautious and attempted to limit receipts to regular commitments. Floor stocks were for the most part in good balance for current dealer needs.
