USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FALL SHARPLY WEDNESDAY AS HOPES DIMINISHING FOR USSR CREDIT PACKAGE DECISION. WHEAT 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. CORN STEADY TO 5 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT KANSAS CITY 2 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 4 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 7 TO 10 CENTS LOWER. PRICES CONTINUE TO LOSE GROUND AS GROWING INDICATIONS THAT U.S. EXPORT CREDIT PACKAGE TO SOVIETS WILL BE SMALLER THAN EXPECTED. DELAYS CONTINUE AND TRADERS REACTING TO JADED PROMISES OF CREDIT ANNOUNCEMENT. EGYPT'S BID FOR 100,000 TONNES U.S. WHEAT ADDED LITTLE SUPPORT TO WHEAT PRICES.


