Prices trended unchanged to higher on cartoned brown shell eggs in New England, higher on all sizes of white eggs. The trade sentiment ranged steady to firm. Breaking stock values trended higher. Offerings to breakers decreased. Floor stocks were adequate. The trade sentiment was firm. Demand for live light type hens was good for the tight supplies. Finished product sales were seasonally good.
