NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to higher in the Midwest and Northeast, unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was generally fully steady to firm. Demand was moderate to good, best for retail spe-

cial and pre-holiday stocking, and also good for trucklot volumes of graded eggs into wholesale distribution channels. Supplies remained short to adequate, and offerings were limited and generally premium priced; however, gradeable nest run eggs tended to sell at steadier prices as limited grading time diminished demand in some areas. Breakers remained disinterested in excess shell egg offers. Live hen offerings were short of next week's reduced schedule needs, and the undertone was steady to firm, mostly fully steady.

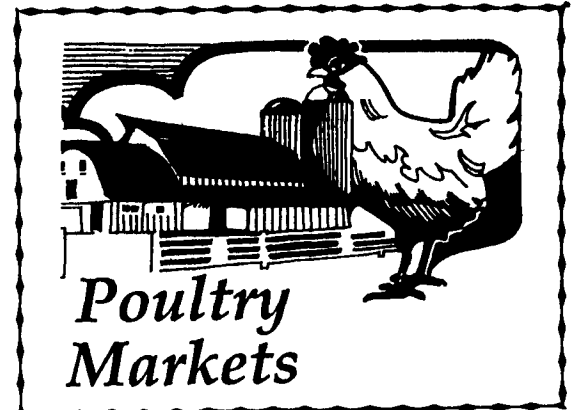

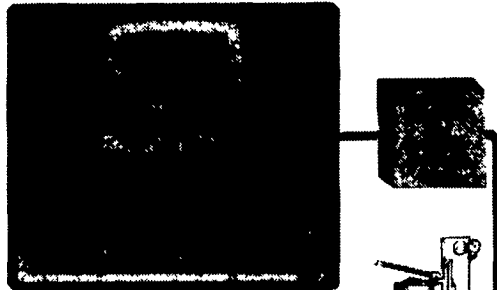
