USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY ON AGAIN, OFF AGAIN PROMISE OF USSR CREDIT ANNOUNCEMENT HAS SOYBEAN AND GRAIN PRICES IN A DITHER AND PRICES GOING IN ALL DIRECTIONS BUT FUTURES HIGHER. REPORTS INDICATE POSSIBLE ANNOUNCEMENT AS EARLY AS THIS AFTERNOON ON AID PACKAGE. WHEAT 2 TO 13 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER EXCEPT MINNEAPOLIS 1 CENT LOWER. SORGHUM 3 TO 16 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER EXCEPT MINNEAPOLIS 1 CENT LOWER. WHEAT PRICES SHOWED MOST ADVANCE DUE TO EXPORT SALES TO CHINA AND SPECULATIONS THAT USSR CREDIT ANNOUNCEMENT WILL BENEFIT WHEAT MARKET MORE THAN CORN AND BEANS.

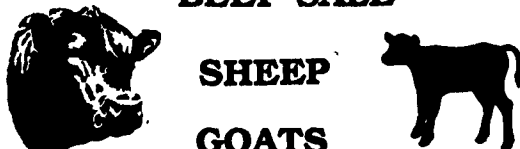

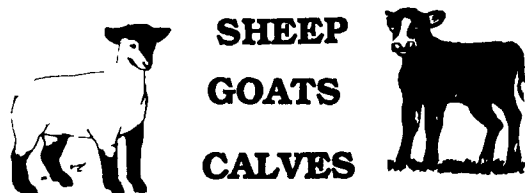
