National Egg Market Nov. 26, 1991

Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Cartoned egg demand was good, and loose egg movement was generally moderate. Supplies of graded eggs were adequate to tight and clearing well for Thanksgiving. Ungraded supplies were adequate, and attracted light buyer interest mostly due to the shortened holiday week grading schedules. Breakers still had adequate shell eggs from regular sources, and demand was sluggish; most breakers ran reduced schedules. Live hen markets were at least steady, and offerings were short to adequate of the light to good demand.


