GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES DECLINED TUESDAY AS DELAYS IN RELEASE OF USSR CREDIT DETAILS ADD PRESSURE TO PRICES. WHEAT 2 TO 8 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES FELL SHARPLY AS TRADERS TOOK LONG LIQUIDATION OF WHAT IS THOUGHT TO BE AN OVERBOUGHT MARKET. DELAYS OF DETAILS FOR SOVIET CREDIT ALLOCATIONS HAVE TRADERS NERVOUS. CORN AND BEAN PRICES WEAKENED IN SYMPATHY WITH WHEAT PRICE DECLINES.

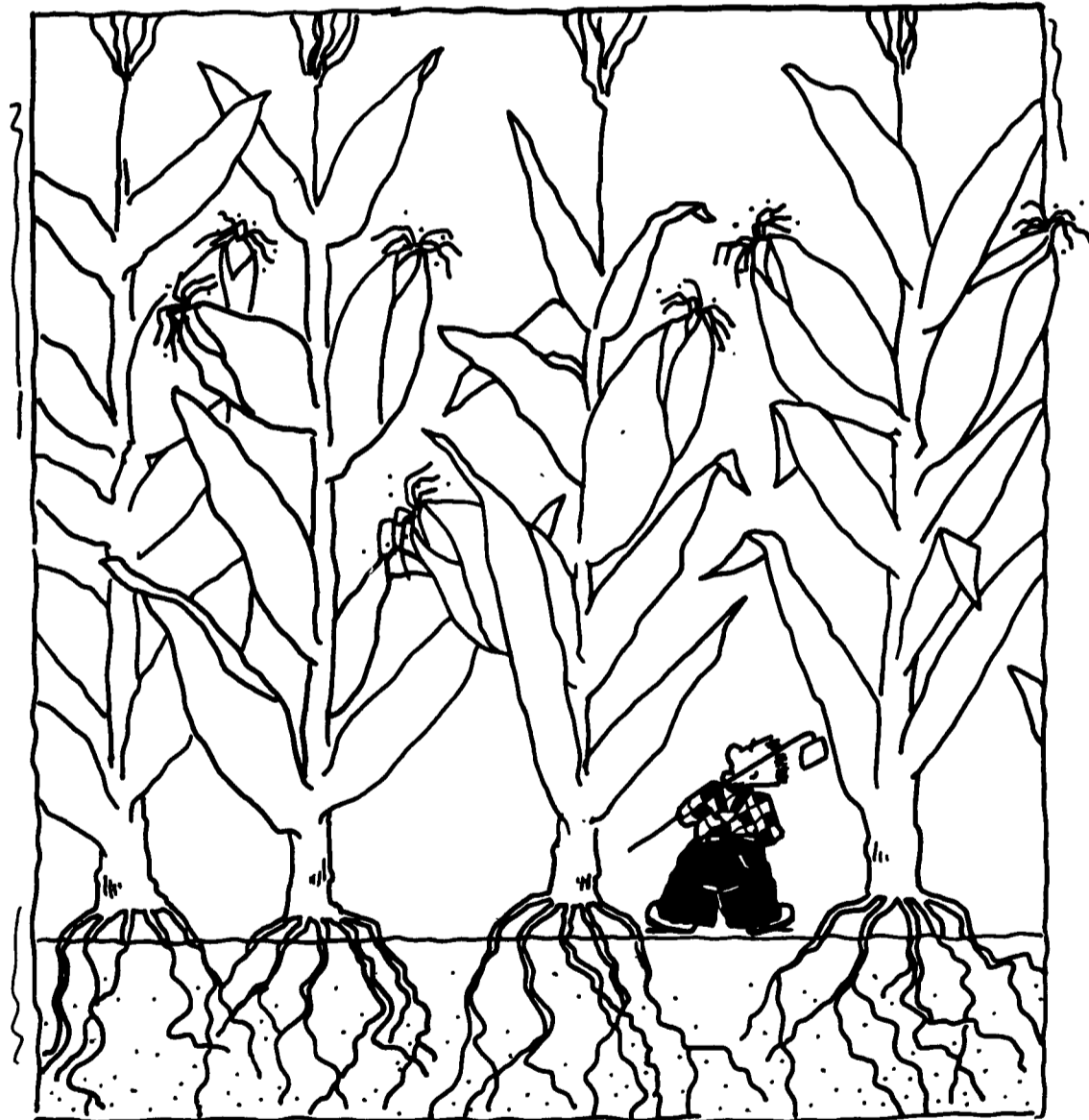
