USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY **CORRECTION ON YEAR AGO SO. IOWA BEANS WHEAT PRICES CONTINUE HIGHER; CORN AND BEAN PRICES REBOUNDED FROM YESTERDAY'S DISAPPOINTING CLOSE. WHEAT 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. CORN STEADY TO 1 CENT HIGHER SORGHUM 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 7 TO 9 CENTS HIGHER. IDEAS USSR WILL SOON BID FOR PROMPT SHIPMENT OF WHEAT, ADDED SUPPORT TO ALREADY RISING WHEAT PRICES. OTHER SMALL EXPORT INTERESTS CONTRIBUTED TO GAINS IN WHEAT PRICES. INCREASE IN CORN PRICES DUE TO CONTINUED OPTIMISM FOR ADDITIONAL SALES, DESPITE THE LESS THAN EXPECTED AMOUNT OF CORN ALLOCATED TO USSR. REPORTS INDICATE MEXICO IS ALSO SEEKING CORN AND BEAN OFFERS. SOYBEAN PRICES SURGED AFTER DROPPING SHARPLY TUESDAY. GAINS WERE BROUGHT ABOUT BY USSR'S SUBSTANTIAL SOYMEAL ORDER AND OTHER EXPORT INTERESTS IN BEANS AND SOYOLS.

EXPORT NEWS: THE COMMODITY CREDIT CORP BOUGHT 17,300 TONNES U.S. HARD RED WINTER WHEAT USING PL480 FINANCING FOR ALBANIA WITH SHIPMENT DECEMBER. WEST AND CENTRAL AFRICAN NATIONS BOUGHT 5,000 TONNES WHEAT FLOUR UNDER EBP FOR JANUARY. THE SOVIET UNION BOUGHT 300,000 TONNES U.S. SOYMEAL UNDER ITS NEW GSM-102 FINANCING FOR DECEMBER TO JANUARY SHIPMENT. USSR BOUGHT 100,000 METRIC TONS SOYBEAN MEAL FOR 91/92 MARKETING YEAR. EGYPT BOUGHT 30,000 TONNES OPTIONAL- ORIGIN SUNOIL AND 15,000 TONNES OPTIONAL-ORIGIN COTTONSEED OIL FOR DECEMBER. ALGERIA BOUGHT 6,000 TONNES SUNOIL UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
