HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Pennsylvania Milk Marketing Board will conduct a public hearing for Milk Marketing Area No.s 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, to be held 9 a.m., Jan. 9, in Room 309 of the Agriculture Building, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg.

This hearing is being held oursuant to the provisions of the Milk Marketing Law, 31 P.S. Section 700j-101 et seq., as amended July 31, 1968, P.L. 963, No. 294.

Testimony shall be received concerning the effects of the drought of 1991, as same would affect minimum prices which milk dealers shall pay producers for various classes of milk, minimum prices which milk dealers shall charge to consumers, minimum prices milk dealers shall charge to wholesale customers such as stores, restaurants, institutions, and the like, and minimum prices


