The New Jersey inventory was 1% above last Monday's level, and the New York inventory was 18% below last week.

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast and Midwest, unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was barely steady to mostly weak. Cartoned egg demand covered the full range, mostly fair, and best into retail channels. Demand for graded or ungraded loose eggs was light to fair into food service channels, and generally light at the packer level. Supplies were adequate to ample. Surplus eggs were offered in all regions, and current negotiated trades continued to be at discounts. Breakers received adequate shell eggs from contracted sources, and surplus egg purchases increased as prices dropped. Live hen offerings increased, and were generally fully adequate for the light to moderate demand; trade sentiment was barely steady to steady.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS. FEDERAL-STATE: Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were short of meeting today's active buying interest. Yellow skin breasts were tight with inquiries for late week deliveries not covered. Legs, leg quarters and wings were also short of immediate needs. Trading and asking prices for most parts trended higher and the trade sentiment was firm. Distributors and retailers anticipate demand to improve through first of the month.
