

SRBC Appoints New Director

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — In a conference call meeting held Jan. 13, the Susquehanna River Basin Commission unanimously appointed Mr. Paul O. Swartz as the new executive director of the commission.

Swartz has been the director of the Pennsylvania Department of

Environmental Resources' Bureau of Soil & Water Conservation for the past ten years.

In his former capacity, he managed the commonwealth's Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Program and directed the state's efforts to reduce pollution to the Chesapeake Bay from agri-

cultural sources.

Under his leadership, Pennsylvania has pioneered a program of farm nutrient management designed to improve water quality, both in the Bay and Pennsylvania waters.

In addition to directing Pennsylvania's Chesapeake Bay Program, Mr. Swartz has represented the commonwealth on the Chesapeake Bay Implementation Committee and the Interstate Commission on the Potomac River Basin.

He is currently executive secretary to the Pennsylvania Conservation Commission which establishes policy for Pennsylvania's 66 conservation districts.

Swartz also served with the Pa. Joint Legislative Conservation

Committee and from 1974-1981, was the first full-time executive director of the Dauphin County, Pa. Conservation District.

He is a 1970 graduate of Gettysburg College with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in psychology and has done graduate work in public administration at Pennsylvania State University. A native Pennsylvanian, he resides with his wife, Patricia, and their three sons near Hershey, Pa.

The commission also unanimously appointed Mr. Richard A. Cairo as the secretary/general counsel to the Commission. Mr. Cairo has served in the post of Secretary to the commission for the past 13 years.

His duties have included public administration, public information

and in-house legal services as staff counsel.

He also worked for the commission as a planning analyst for one year where he was mainly involved in the National Flood Insurance Program studies carried out by the SRBC.

Cairo holds Bachelor of Social Science and Master of Regional Planning degrees from the Pennsylvania State University and a Juris Doctorate degree from the Dickinson School of Law. He is a member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and is admitted to practice before the United States District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania. He is also a native Pennsylvanian and currently resides in Enola.
