for a properly controlled environment.

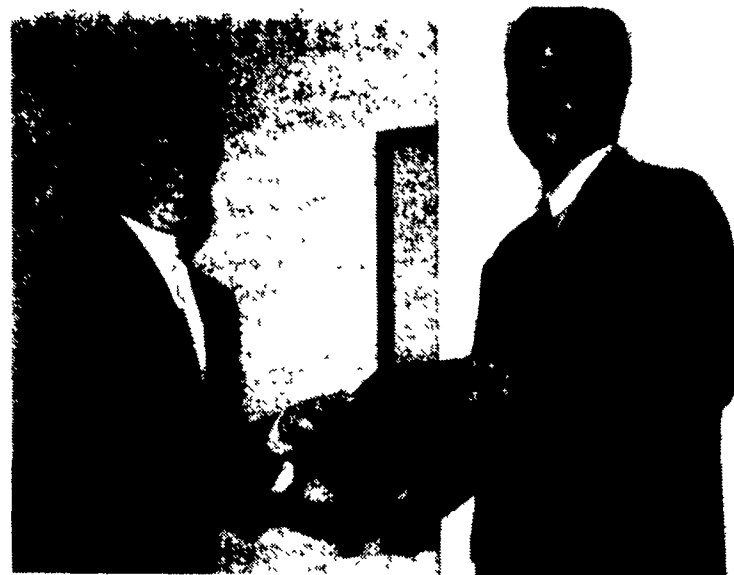
By the year 2000, said Kurtis, "gene manipulation will be amazing all of us."

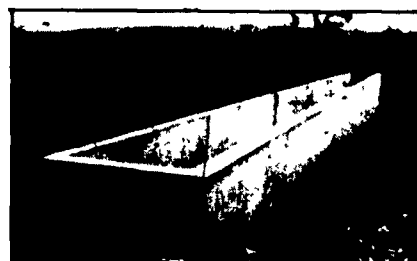

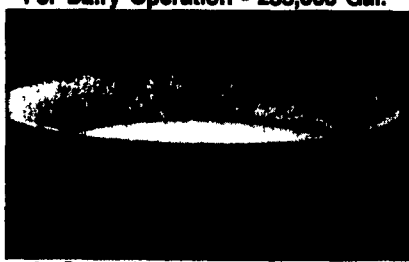

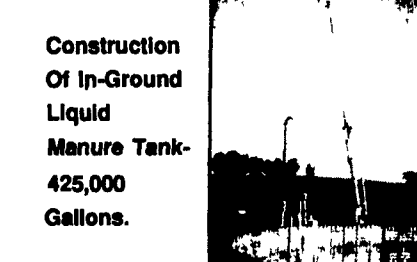
Above-Ground Liquid Manure Tank For Dairy Operation - 235,000 Gal.
